The results show that the perception of the facilitators on f the potential benefits of virtual environments decreased after the test. They mentioned many limitations of the technology with regard to the usual facilitation process. Moreover, these results have provided design perspectives to make virtual technologies more acceptable and usable for creativity facilitators.



EFFECTIVE COORDINATION OF SHARED LEADERSHIP IN GLOBAL VIRTUAL TEAMS

The findings contributed to theory and practice by showing that when leadership is highly shared in the team and uncoordinated, it may actually lead to detrimental effects in terms of lower team effectiveness. In contrast, shared leadership may reap its potential benefits if it is well coordinated.



NATURE AND NURTURE: THE IMPACT OF AUTOMATICITY AND THE STRUCTURATION OF COMMUNICATION ON VIRTUAL TEAM BEHAVIOR AND PERFORMANCE

The findings suggest that habitual use of the automatic enactment of genre rules for a communication tool may have as powerful an effect on behavior and performance as the actual features of the tool itself. The results have taken together with past research showing the effects of social structures on

communication, call for the expansion of task-technology fit theories to include the role of social structures in explaining the use of and performance from communication tools.

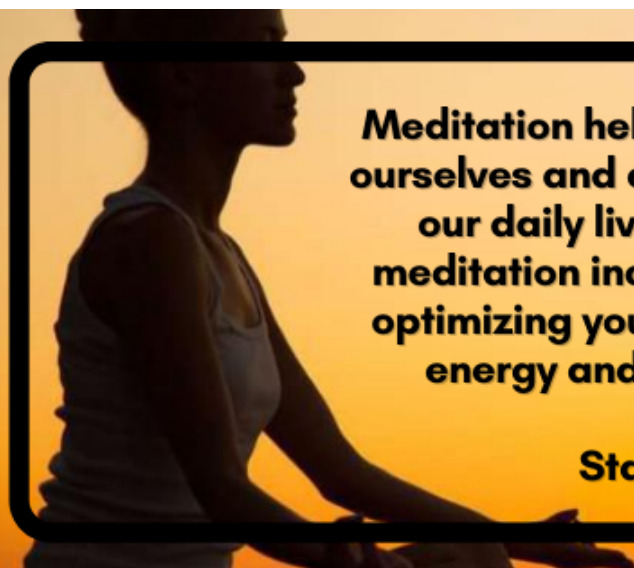

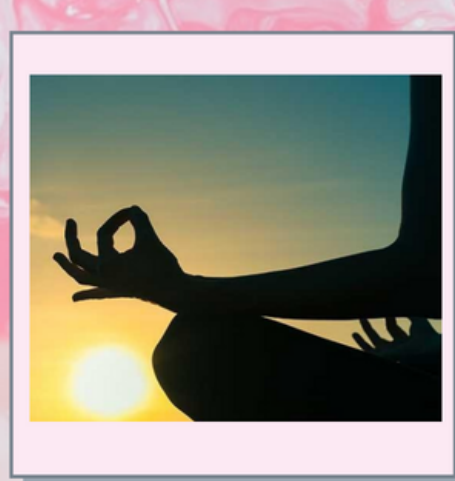

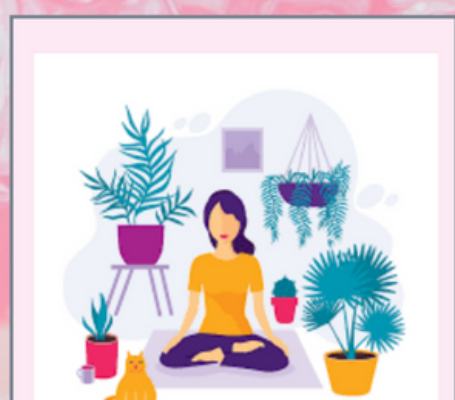

The study showed the interrelationships between positive leadership, flow, task performance, mindfulness and meditation, wherein the latter played a vital role.

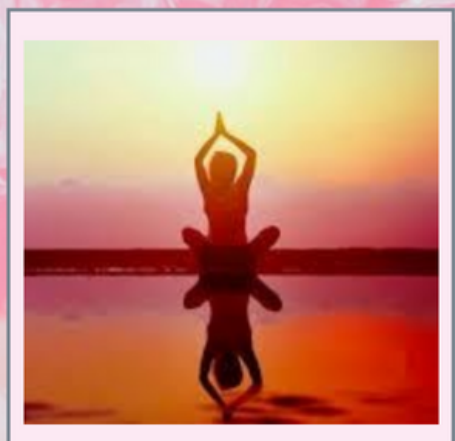
